D owntown South Ber leaders are fashioning creative ways to bring the St. Joseph Valley Metronet's vast broad band and connectivity advantages to smaller businesses in large metenant buildings down town.

The "lit building" a proach provides a way for tenants to share the price of bringing servinto the building, estallishing an economy of scale that reduces cosfor everyone while increasing the available technology.

"It brings Metronel type applications into these select buildings where you've got a cocentration of users," s Bryan Baker, a partnewith Com Control, explaining that the tech ogy does for medium small businesses what Metronet does for lar users.
